BADGERS CULLED IN SOMERSET

THE BURNHAM BADGERS 5.5

NOW WE'RE FARMING 6.5

Just across the water from Porthcawl— site of the first matches in 2011— The Tanglwyst Cup made its first venture to the West Country for its 14th iteration, in Somerset. New kid on the block, Pennington, was welcomed in for his long awaited call-up to TC proper whilst stalwarts Edwards, Robinson and Mullin maintained their 100% participation record

Burnham & Berrow, longtime venue for The Open qualifying, played host for the opening fourballs on a picture perfect afternoon. On a tough course, the last 2 matches were each only ever led by one team whereas the front match was a ding-dong affair that seemed to be heading in the Badger's favour until a par-par finish from NWF's pairing of Laffan and Edwards clawed them back from dormy 2 to earn a half-point. The result—for only the second time ever, and first time since 2016—was a halved opening day.

Weston Super Mare offered up an equally sunny but significantly friendlier challenge on day two. However, that made little difference to Jenkins who, in the lead-out group and with the all-time consecutive losses record on the line, battled with demons possibly never before seen at TC. And so, despite playing partner Hoare not having missed a shot, they found themselves 3 down after 3. Thanks to

continued excellence from Hoare with occasional contributions on the green from Jenkins—the NWF pair kept within touching distance of opponents Cooke and Davidson and sensed a pivotable moment when Cooke hit an approach to the 13th agonisingly long. Two duffed chips later and the matched flipped on its head as NWF won 4 in 5 holes before a befitting conclusion as NWF looked to have blown their advantage on the 17th before Jenkins rescued with a 20ft putt to close out the match. As the front group drama unfolded, NWF closed out two further wins in the matches behind to open up a 3 point overnight lead.



No team has ever overturned a day 2 deficit to win a TC and so the odds were stacked against the Badgers as they arrived at Enmore Park. The usual day 3 scrambling for waterproofs, second gloves and buggies ensued as the heavens opened in spectacular fashion ahead of the singles matches teeing off. A well matched set of singles matches gave a glimmer of hope to Davidson's men who took that belief out onto the course. The top four matches were tight affairs throughout and, through 14 holes respectively, the Badgers found themselves up in 5 of the 6 matches. They would go on to close out 3 of those with holes to spare, whilst NWF had claimed only a solitary point to leave the score at 5.5-4.5 with just



the middle matches still left out on the course. As those matches went up the short par-4 17th hole, Badgers' Mullin led Hoare 1 up whilst Davidson and Laffan remained all square. After Davidson had topped his approach to a gimme par and with Mullin also in close for a par it left both NWF players with medium length putts to avoid heading to 18 down in both matches. These are the moments in which TCs are won and lost and the NWF pair sensed it as Hoare holed his -20ft birdie putt followed by Laffan—still reeling from Davidson's previous shot—who holed a clutch par putt to leave both matches all-square on the 18th tee. As exciting as the 17th had been, the 18th would prove somewhat anti-climatic as the greatest of comebacks was finally halted by a regulation par from Hoare that could not be matched by Mullin. Davidson would eek out a victory in the other match but NWF had already reached the holy grail of 6.5 points—earning Captain Robinson his 9th star.

Only once has a team emerged victorious without **ROBINSON** or **HOARE** being on it. **ROBINSON** will have his eyes set on an unprecedented 10th star having only ever tasted defeat twice. Meanwhile, **COOKE** is searching for his first star since 2018.



The TCXV teams are statistically the most lopsided in history with **THE PHEONIX KNIGHTS'** 28 stars to **THIN TO VIN'S** 20 and a head-to-head of 70-54 in TC points.

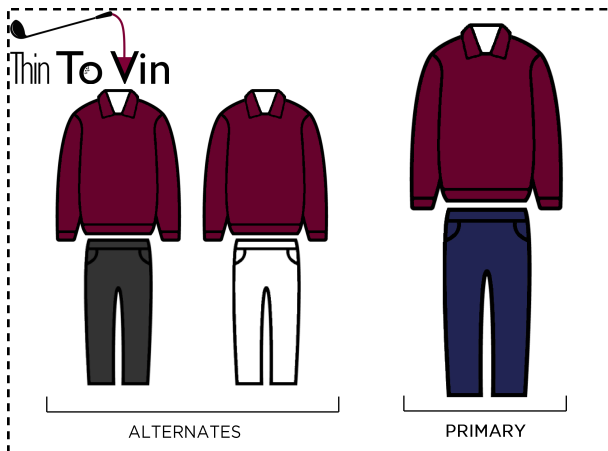
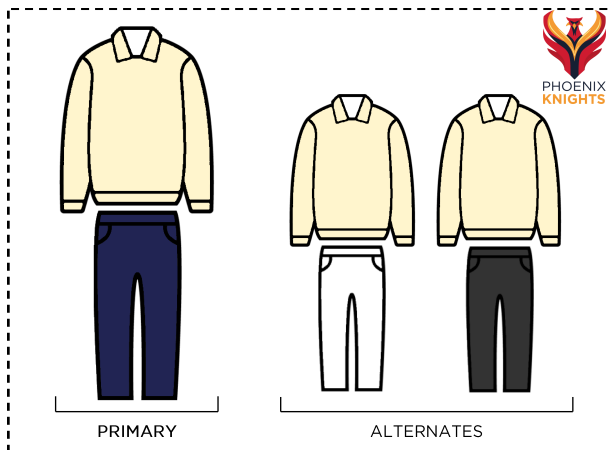
After recording his first hattrick since the inaugural TC, **HOARE** has closed to within one point of **ROBINSON** as the all-time leading points scorer.

MULLIN followed up back-to-back hattricks with a winless 2024 but avoided a record 6th bagel. **JENKINS** equalled **EDWARDS'** record of 8 consecutive defeats before eventually getting a win on day 2 in 2024, thus ensuring that **EDWARDS'** all-time winless streak of 16 lives on. **HOARE** holds the longest active winning/undefeated streak of 4.



KING is still on a quest for his first ever hattrick—is this the year where he prioritises a 3-0 over the beer.

Neither **MULLIN** or **SHIRLEY** have ever been a losing captain. **DAVIDSON** failed, yet again, to lead a team to victory in 2024 — his third attempt at doing so.

Day 1 — *FOURBALLS*
Woodbridge GC
Thursday 9th October

Type: Heathland
Par: 70
Yards: 6,469
NP: 15
LD: 8



Founded in 1893, the formation of Woodbridge Golf Club was entirely due to Major Howey, who originally laid out six holes on parkland in front of his house. Intent on creating a first class course, the Major enlisted Davie Grant – the famous North Berwick professional – to find suitable land. Bromeswell Heath was eventually identified and the club moved to the heath. In 1908 a certain Mr Fryer redesigned the course and, some twenty years later, James Braid stepped in to reshape Woodbridge. Subsequently Fred W. Hawtree made further modifications to the layout.

“The best course in Suffolk today is, I think, an inland one, Woodbridge, though I say this with diffidence and with great respect for its friendly rival, Aldeburgh, which is likewise excellent,” wrote Bernard Darwin in *The Golf Courses of Great Britain*. “Woodbridge has everything in the world that one could desire except the sea. It has sand and bracken and gorse, beautiful turf and the smoothest

of greens. There is a delightful feeling of being on a hill-top, there is a fine big view, and there is peace and quiet and rusticity."

Measuring 6,299 yards from the medal tees, the Heath course is not long, but the golf is truly engaging. There isn't a single poor hole on the course; many are excellent, varied and entertaining. Make your score on the front nine where there are two par fives, the back nine is a tough prospect with four par fours measuring in excess of 400 yards. The 14th, called "St Andrews Hill", is one of our favourite two-shotters with its well-guarded two-tiered green. The 15th is a cracking one-shot hole which requires a well struck mid iron to reach the sanctuary of the elevated green which is jealously protected by six bunkers.

Martin Hawtree completed a bunker refurbishment project in 2020, with a dozen sand hazards completely rebuilt. At the same time, contractors removed gorse, scrub and trees in line with a long-term strategic plan developed by its STRI agronomist.



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Day 2 — FOURSOMES

Aldeburgh GC

Friday 10th October

Type: Heathland
Par: 70

Founded in 1884, Aldeburgh Golf Club is one of the oldest golf clubs in Suffolk and is separated from the tidal Alde estuary by an unusual strip of coastal heathland. Although the Championship course itself is ostensibly heathland, its close proximity to the estuary and the North Sea provides a salty whiff of sea air.

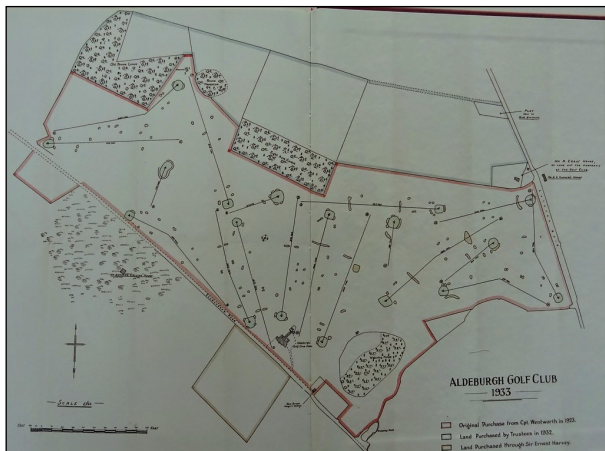
Aldeburgh was originally designed by John Thompson and Willie Fernie and modified at the turn of the 20th century by Willie Park Junior and J.H.Taylor. Hugh Alison and Harry Colt made further modifications to the course in the 1920s. Benjamin Britten once lived close to the course, bringing fame to the town through the internationally renowned music festivals at Snape Maltings.

Playing Aldeburgh, you will be presented with beautiful narrow fairways weaving their way between bright yellow gorse. You will be hard-pressed to find such an awe-inspiring sight at any golf

course. Clearly, you need to be on top of your game. Looking for golf balls in this terrain is a painful business. "I am also very fond of Aldeburgh," wrote Darwin, "though now and again when I am sore and spiky from sitting in gorse bushes, and hot and tired from searching for my ball, I could wish there was just a little less gorse."

Deep, sleeper-faced bunkers protect some of the greens. Combine this with the ever-changing wind and you are presented with an excellent a golfing challenge. Or as Darwin said: "I know no course more likely to teach driving accuracy. There is nearly always a wind on that most pleasant heath, and there are very often avenues of gorse, and you simply must keep straight."

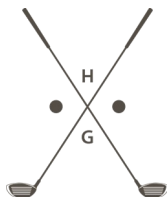
Aldeburgh is a traditional two-ball club; foursomes, not three or four-ball play is the order of the day. Aldeburgh Golf Club has hosted a number of important ladies and men's amateur events over the years, but it's a course the average handicap golfer will also enjoy enormously.





Day 3 — SINGLES
Halesworth GC
Saturday 11th October

Type: Parkland

Halesworth Golf is a well-regarded golf club situated in 190 acres of scenic Suffolk countryside, offering facilities for players of all levels. The club is located near the Suffolk heritage coast and features two courses, a modern clubhouse, and various practice facilities.

The club's history extends back to 1990, when the original 18-hole course was first opened. Known as The Blyth, the 18 hole Championship Course is A 6,523-yard, par-72 course that offers a challenging game for experienced players. It is well-maintained year-round, with lush fairways, true greens, and no temporary greens or tees during the winter months. The course was recently redesigned and is known for its excellent upkeep.

The club offers a variety of practice options, including a floodlit, driving range, a putting green, and a chipping green. The club house features a bar/restaurant with scenic views of the course.

Following on from a significant improvement in recent years, the players are once again reminded of the necessity to ensure a reasonable pace-of-play during this year's matches. **4 hours should be the maximum length of each round** and we'll be expected to go significantly quicker than that during the foursomes matches.

One player in each group shall oversee the pace of play with a general rule of 3 holes per 40 minutes. Nightly fines will be issued to all players involved in a non-compliant group. The Enforcer will decide on the severity of these fines with a multiplier rule for multiple offences.

Further rules...

1. The Committee is formed of an Honorary President, a Secretary and a Treasurer.
2. The Medicine Man, appointed by the Committee, will be on duty at all times and will always know the best cure for your symptoms.
3. The Enforcer, appointed by the President, will distribute fines and punishments.
4. Recon – the official helper and appointed by the Secretary - is a pivotal role to ensure that everything runs as smoothly as possible. A good Recon will always be thinking one step ahead.
5. The Kitty Man, appointed by the Treasurer, will maintain the kitty and take responsibility for the purchase of beverages. Never refuse to pay the Kitty Man.
6. The Choirboy, appointed by the committee, will be in charge of songs and entertainment.
7. The Peer Mediator, appointed by the Enforcer, will help to resolve disputes and report any crimes to the Enforcer.
8. Mates above all else.
9. Captains' match picks will be handed to the Secretary and announced on the eve of each round of matches.
10. No two team mates shall be paired together for both fourballs and greensomes.
11. Tanglwyst matches are played according to the world handi-

cap system. Each player's WGH index must be adjusted for each course's slope rating. Per WGH, 100% handicaps will be used for singles, 90% handicaps for fourballs and the full difference between each pairs' greensomes handicap* will be used for greensomes.



12. The R&A rules of golf apply to all matches, including rules regarding lost balls, out-of-bounds, etc.
13. Golf apps and range finders are permitted on the course.
14. The 'willies out' rule is in operation.
15. Player of the year, Clubman of the Year, Yip of the Year and Course of the Year will be decided by a vote following the conclusion of Round 3.
16. Failure to produce your Tanglwyst Handbook when requested by the Committee/Enforcer will result in a fine.
